

The family have brought symbols of Paul's life as gifts to join him here today, also reminding us that he loved to give little gifts before we went our separate ways.

Xavier brings Paul's baseball cap because he never went on a journey without choosing a cap from his vast collection, and he also had a great love of all sports, both playing and watching.

Parisa brings up a cake because Paul had quite a sweet tooth and loved a cake or biscuit with his coffee, keeping a great collection for his visitors. But he also had great knowledge of traditional food and was an amazing cook who loved to feed everyone.

Alice brings part of Paul's prayer collection, a lottery slip and glasses, as he often sought divine intervention for a winning ticket, but mostly because his religious cards always brought him great comfort, often giving them away as gifts. During his last weeks, he especially held the Holy Family and Saint Padre Pio.

Isabella brings Paul's crucifix which he always wore around his neck and she brings a plant, as he loved so many aspects of nature, both of these representing his faith and connection to God.

Olivia brings up a candle because Paul lit candles for loved ones, both here and departed, every day. He loved their light and it is a symbol of his deep devotion to family, friends and their wellbeing.

Sophia brings one of Paul's repair tools, a symbol of his working life as a mechanic, an electronics engineer, and his lifelong passion for DIY - also symbolising his great generosity - no mission was impossible and he was always willing to help in whatever way he could.

And for Louie, Anna brings Paul's treasured Freedom Bus Pass and phone which took him on many adventures around London, and sometimes beyond. In his younger years, he would also bring a walkman with earphones, as he really enjoyed music and radio.

Love is patient and kind, it is not jealous or conceited or proud; love is not ill-mannered or selfish or irritable; love does not keep a record of wrongs; love is not happy with evil, but is happy with the truth. Love never gives up; and its faith, hope and patience never fail.

Love is eternal. There are inspired messages, but they are temporary; there are gifts of speaking in strange tongues, but they will cease; there is knowledge, but it will pass. For our gift of knowledge is only partial, but when what is perfect comes, that which is partial will disappear.


